- TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING
- TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS IS MODERN DAY SLAVERY

How Do Traffickers Control Their Victims

- PHYSICAL AND/OR SEXUAL ABUSE
- THREATS OF PHYSICAL AND/OR SEXUAL VIOLENCE
- THREATS OF HARM TOWARDS THE VICTIM'S FAMILY,
 IF A REPORT IS MADE
- THREATS OF DEPORTATION
- DEMANDING REPAYMENT OF (NEVER-ENDING) DEBT
- CONTROL OF IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENTS
- CONTROL/DENIAL OF ACCESS TO FAMILY/BASIC SERVICES
- ISOLATING THE VICTIMS
- MAKING FALSE PROMISES

How Can A Victim Of Trafficking In Persons Be Identified?

A VICTIM MAY:

- BELIEVE THAT THEY HAVE NO CHOICE BUT TO WORK
- BE UNABLE TO LEAVE THE WORKPLACE
- HAVE INJURIES OR MARKS THAT SHOW THAT THEY HAVE BEEN CONTROLLED
- RECEIVE LITTLE OR NO PAYMENT
- RESERVED AND NOT BE ABLE TO TALK FREELY WITH OTHERS
- WORK VERY LONG HOURS, WITH NO DAYS OFF

Children Who Have Been Trafficked May:

- HAVE LIMITED SOCIAL INTERACTION
- HAVE NO ACCESS TO EDUCATION
- HAVE NO TIME FOR PLAYING
- DO WORK THAT ADULTS SHOULD DO
- HAVE NO ACCESS TO PARENTS OR GUARDIANS
